International Conference from June 30 – July 3, 2013 in Aix-en-Provence

Secularity: Opportunity or Peril for Religions, The French Experience and Global Perspectives

GENERAL INFORMATION

The 2013 annual conference of the International Council of Christians and Jews (ICCJ) will be held in Aix-en-Provence, June 30 - July 3. The ICCJ is honoured to co-host the conference with the French Amitié Judéo-Chrétienne de France and the Amitié Judéo-Chrétienne Aix/Marseille in co-operation with the Interuniversity Institute of Jewish Studies and Culture.

The theme chosen for the conference is 'Secularity: Opportunity or Peril for Religions? The French Experience and Global Perspectives'. The conference commemorates the fiftieth anniversary of the passing of Jules Isaac, the well-known French historian who coined the phrase "the teaching of contempt" and who was among the first after the Shoah to be engaged in Jewish-Christian dialogue. Jules Isaac was one of the Founders of the French Amitié Judéo-Chrétienne and of the International Council of Christians and Jews.

Registration

Please register for the 2013 ICCJ conference on our homepage www.iccj.org. Fill in the registration form and indicate your way of payment. Please note: Outside the Euro zone payment only by credit card.

Program

The welcome for the conference will start on Sunday June 30, 4 pm, at the Campanile Hotel. Conference delegates will receive their conference packages there. An opening session will be held at the conference center "La Baume" highlighting the significance of Jules Isaac. The opening dinner also will be at "La Baume".

Following the three plenary sessions on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday, there will be a total of 15 workshops, which will address a wide range of themes. After registration on www.iccj.org participants will be asked in due time to sign up for their workshops.

On Monday a visit will be paid to "Camp des Milles", a concentration and deportation camp near Aix-en-Provence. A visit to the site and a lecture on "Genocide and Modernity" will be on the program this afternoon. On Tuesday afternoon there will be outings in Aix-en-Provence. At the end of the afternoon all participants will gather in the Jardin Vendôme for a reception hosted by the City Council of Aix-en-Provence. The evening is free. Details concerning the outings will be advised in due course.

Once participants have registered they will be regularly updated on the conference program by email.

Young Leadership Council and International Abrahamic Forum

The ICCJ Young Leadership Council and the ICCJ International Abrahamic Forum will have their own meetings in the days preceding the ICCJ conference. As from Sunday June 30 there will be, as in recent years, an overlap with the ICCJ conference program. ICCJ, IAF and YLC conference participants are welcome to take part in the respective Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday workshops. See the conference program for detailed information.

Transfers

All transfers will be by coach. Coaches leave on Sunday evening, Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday morning from the Campanile Hotel.

Hotel reservation

The conference hotel is the Campanile Hotel. You are requested to make your reservations directly with the Campanile Hotel. On a first-come, first-served base 80 rooms (60 single and 20 double) will be blocked for ICCJ conference participants. Settle your bill when checking out from the hotel.

Students

Travel to Aix-en-Provence

Most participants will arrive by air. Marseille/Provence Airport is approx. 25 kilometers from the hotel. There are two ways to reach the Campanile Hotel from the airport:

- Taxi: A single fare, depending on traffic etc., will be approx. € 90.00.
- Bus: You may find the bus stand for the shuttle bus to Aix-en-Provence right in front of the arrival hall at the airport. This bus will drop you at the Aix City Bus Station. Take from there a local taxi.

Some participants will arrive by train. Aix-en-Provence Gare TGV is half way between the airport and the city center. Taxis always are available. The Airport Shuttle Bus also calls at Aix Gare TGV.
